From the Rector:

There is a lot of good news, and a few challenges, to share in this Bellringer article! First off, I get to formally announce that Christine Jones was named a Postulant in this Diocese. That means that she is able to attend seminary and dive further into discernment about becoming a priest in the Episcopal Church. We pray for her and wish her well as she explores her vocation. We also pray for Julie, her wife, as she too explores what this means for Chris and herself. Of course, this means that we will be sending Chris off to seminary, and that she will have to commit her time to being there and not here, but we will plan a big send off before her fall term begins, and we hope to see her on school breaks.

Secondly, we are busily preparing for Junefest. We have had the clothing sale going on for the past week, and everyone seems excited about making this the best Junefest possible. Hopefully, there will be no tornado threats, like last year. Even the youth group has been working on Children's Games. And since we have been unable to secure goldfish, due to a variety of circumstances, I'm certain that this year, at least, our success will not be shouldered on the backs of hundreds of sacrificial goldfish. All of this, to me, reflects a desire for us to be together as a parish family and to be resourceful for the betterment of our community.


Thirdly, there is a lot of excitement in the larger diocese. We have just celebrated The Rt. Rev. Catherine Roskam's 15th anniversary as our Suffragan Bishop, and we are preparing to elect an eventual replacement, a bishop co-adjutor, for The Rt. Rev. Mark Sisk in October. That means that there will be a lot of changes in the coming years in the diocesan structure. Bishop Roskam will leave her post at the end of this year. And Bishop Sisk will most likely serve a short time with the new co-adjutor before retiring himself. All of this is exciting and challenging. It is exciting to think of new possibilities. But I also tend to believe the issues that we will have to address in the election will reflect a wider challenge to our Church and diocese.

In the past years, the circumstances of being Church have changed in great and small ways. I'm sure that you see it in our own financial struggles. And in this area, several surrounding churches have had to go to part time priests. And others are struggling in ways that we have, luckily, not yet had to face. My own seminary has now sold half of its property in Manhattan (all since I graduated in 2002). There are many hypotheses as to why this has happened, but the question of how to go on, being a church focused on the love of God in changed and reduced circumstances, has not been adequately addressed.

Of course, this is troubling. But I also hope that it is exciting. At no time since before the time of Constantine in the fourth century, other than perhaps the Reformation, has the Church had to look at itself in the mirror and change according to what it sees. We have never had to be so honest, vulnerable, and reflective in how we proceed in our proclamation of God's love. And I really do believe that that is a good thing. Too much in the way of resources for parishes, like our lives, can result in walls between us and those who need us. If we do not have those walls, I wonder what our church can become? And so I pray for a good bishop who, along with the Holy Spirit, can inspire and lead us in that process.

Which brings me full-circle. Chris Jones, Junefest, the Diocese of New York. All of these are the ways in which we attempt to follow and proclaim the love of God in a changing world. May we each, in our own ways, rise to the challenge.

Treasurer's April 2011 Report

Our operating performance for the first four months of 2011 is better than what we had expected it to be in the budget we passed last December. Expenses have been slightly lower than expected in most categories as we continue to operate our church and other buildings and programs as prudently as possible. Revenues have also been fairly close to our budget. Current Year Pledges are behind the budget, but that is mostly attributable to timing issues in receipt of pledge payments, and is mitigated by better than expected receipts under the Mid-year Pledges category (pledges received after the annual meeting). One area of concern is the lack of fundraising events to date as compared to this time last year, when we had already hosted a Pub Quiz and a Chili Cook-off. Hopefully we can plan some fun and affordable fundraising events in the near future, which would help us show better than budgeted results.
